To earn a certificate, students must complete the four core classes starred (\*) below. Ten hours of field work per week are required for each of the four core classes. Classes may be taken in any order. Infant Studies is offered for students who plan to work with infants. Classes meet the core qualifications for infant/pre-school teachers and/or directors set by the State Department of Social Services, the licensing agency for child care centers.

**Prerequisites:** Young adult counselor approval (for concurrently enrolled high school students); reading test (Test schedule on pg. 14); interview following orientation. T.B. test required for field training.

## Cosmetology

**Orientation & Registration:** Thurs., Aug. 5, 2004

**Cosmetologist/Hair Styling**.....28-17-62

Cosmetology is a 1600 hour course encompassing hair styling, hair-cutting, hair-color, chemical services, make-up, skin care and manicuring. This class prepares you to pass the California State Board licensing examination. The cosmetology license enables you to work as a cosmetologist, esthetician, or manicurist in California.

**Prerequisites:** Must be at least 16 and have completed the 10th grade. Reading entrance exam. (Test schedule on pg. 14) Applicants passing the entrance examination will be placed on a waiting list and notified when orientation will be given. **Must attend the orientation to secure a position in the class.**

Length of Course: 1600 hours. (Approximate Total Cost: \$1,100.)

**Manicurist**.....28-17-55

**Orientation & Registration:** Tues., Oct. 19, 2004 at 2:00 p.m. Room 209

This course covers all the manicuring training required to pass the licensing examination for the California Board of Barbering and Cosmetology. It includes related instruction in professional ethics, state regulations, hygiene, bacteriology, disinfection, sanitation, and safety. You will develop basic skills in the techniques of beauty culture, nail product chemistry, anatomy and physiology, the nails and their disorders, manicuring, pedicuring, nail tips, nail wraps, acrylic nails, gels, nail art, air brushing and drilling.

**Prerequisites:** Must be at least 16 and have completed the 10th grade. Reading entrance exam required. (See test schedule on pg. 14)

**Cosmetologist/Advanced (SKIN CARE)**.....28-17-64

Esthetician is a 600-hour course of cosmetician training conducted under Title 16, Chapter 9, of the rules and regulations issued by the California Board of Cosmetology. This course develops the training skills needed to prepare the trainee for taking and passing the license

examination of the California Board of Cosmetology. Students will learn skin care procedures such as facials (plain, electronic, and chemical), eyebrow arching with tweezers and wax, and daytime, evening, and corrective techniques of make-up.

**Prerequisites:** Must be 16 years of age. Applicant must have completed the tenth grade or have the equivalent of a tenth grade education.

Reading entrance exam required to be on waiting list. (Test schedule on pg. 14)

Length of Course: One semester (600hrs.) (Approximate Total Cost: \$475.00)

**Nurse Assistant/Long-Term Care**

**And Home Health Aide**.....27-03-69

This is a fully accredited classroom and clinical program. Upon successful completion of program and passing of State Nursing Assistant examination, two separate certificates will be awarded: Nursing Assistant and Home Health Aide—providing a broad base for employment opportunities.

**Prerequisites:** Entrance exam (Test schedule on page 14), (BLS) CPR Healthcare Provider Card and Social Security Number. Applicants passing the entrance examination will be placed on a waiting list and notified when there is an opening in the program.

Length of Course: 10 weeks days, 20 weeks evenings.

**Emergency Medical Technician**.....27-06-53

This course offers the training requirements for Emergency Medical Technician 1 (EMT) certification. This includes basic EMT sciences such as anatomy and physiology, emergency medical and trauma care, Obstetrics, Pediatrics, and behavioral emergencies. The course is based on the Los Angeles County Core Curriculum.

**Prerequisites:** At least 18 years of age, evidence of good health, tuberculosis screening, reading and math test (Test Schedule on page 14), and a Basic Life Support (BLS) CPR Healthcare Provider Card.

Length of course: 10 weeks days, 20 weeks evenings.

This course provides review and upgrading in techniques and methods used by the emergency medical technician. Also reviewed are the laws and the regulations affecting the EMT. This course provides the refresher retraining required by the State of California for EMT-1A recertification.

**Prerequisites:** Applicants must possess a current, valid EMT-1A certification or have been certified as an EMT-1A within the last 12 months.
